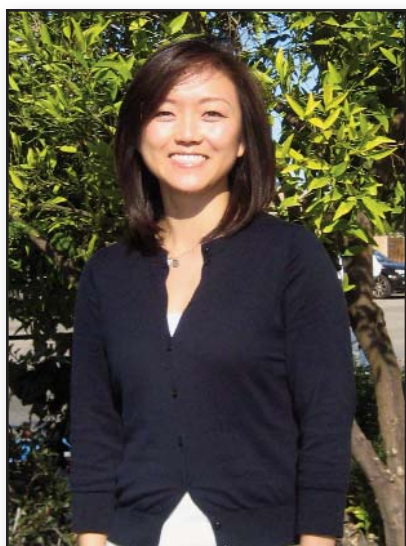

## Meet TLC's New Early Intervention Program Team Update From Children's Program Director, Diana Dennis



Sheila Canales, Occupational Therapist (OT) helps children develop small muscles necessary to daily activities, such as feeding, reaching and grasping. A child learns to explore and interact with a variety of things in their world through the sense of touch.

Spring is in the air and for the past few months I have been busy spreading the word that TLC is ready to provide home-based services to children birth to 5 years of age. In December 2008, I was invited to attend a meeting of the Birth to Five Vision Network. The Birth to Five Vision Network Board is a group of parents and professionals who are dedicated to making information, education, services and support readily available to families and professionals working with young children with visual impairments. They come together with diversified expertise in visual impairment, early intervention, advocacy, deaf-blindness, orientation and mobility, ophthalmologic research, and optometry. Above all, the network is guided by insight and wisdom from parents of children with visual impairments.

A few days after attending this meeting, I was honored to be invited to become a member of the Birth to Five Vision Network Board. This is great news for TLC as it supports the relationships necessary to build our early intervention program. This board is made of key individuals in the field of visual impairments and early intervention and a most fortunate connection for us. I am playing an active role in helping to organize the network's annual, Family/Professional Workshop: *Finding Balance for Yourself and Your Family* which will take place on March 28th, 2009 at Junior Blind of America, in Los Angeles. The cost is \$15.00 per family, \$25 for professionals. Lunch and child care will be provided. To register call: Tori Schladen (310) 458-3501 x171.

## Letter From Executive Director Ford Neale

Dear Friends,

It would be hard to imagine that anyone reading this newsletter is not aware of the very tough times that are upon us. We are barraged by an unending recitation of layoffs and budget cutting. TLC is directly affected by cuts from the Department of Developmental Services and there is a promise of more severe cuts yet to come.

Recently, I conducted staff in-service meetings where we talked about social contracts and the value of upholding the common good: a contract that has continued to be tested and now appears broken. The

correlation between the funds we receive to provide care and the value placed on those who need our care is severely challenged. Basic compassion, decency and a simple sense of doing what is right compels us as a society to adequately fund the programs and services which meet the special needs of the TLC Family.

We regularly remind staff that the value of what they do cannot be determined by their pay check or benefit package. There are some things that have intrinsic value, such as the difficult work and responsibility involved with client care, for which they will never be adequately compensated.

I know that you would want me to tell them that everyone at TLC, including consumers, families, administration, directors and trustees, appreciates their commitment and recognizes the

sizable gap between work performed and compensation received.

I am asking you, as someone who is associated with this organization, to do your part to let others know of TLC staff's valuable contribution to our clients' wellbeing and the social contract we are all responsible for maintaining.

We as a society are at an important juncture in our ability to maintain quality services for the developmentally disabled. I urge you to let your representatives know what *your* values are.

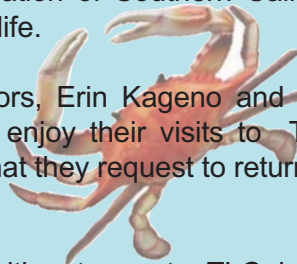
Instructors, Erin Kageno and Crystal Gentle, enjoy their visits to TLC so much that they request to return every year.

# Client Spotlight: Meet Barbara



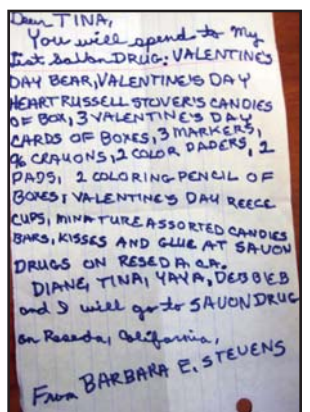
Barbara has been a part of the TLC family for several years. She has a syndrome that effects her vision and hearing. Barbara communicates through sign language, Braille and writing.
